





VO: Our kidneys do lots of important things in our body



VO: apart from making urine or 'wee' to get rid of waste so we don't get poorly




VO: they keep our blood pressure in the right range



Scene 7 Polycystic 'lots[']holes

VO: Poly means 'lots', cystic means 'holes'. Anim: animate to underline poly and then arrow to 'lots' and then underline cystic then arrow 'holes'



VO: polycystic kidney disease (or PKD) is unusual. The kidneys get lots of small cysts or "holes" in them.




VO: These are balloons of fluid that can grow over time Anim: animate growing cysts

VO: some are as small as a pea and some are bigger!




VO: As they grow, they can make the kidneys very big overall Anim: Animate kidney increasing in size



What causes PKD?


VO: but also stop them from doing their job properly.

VO: you get one copy each of all your genes from your mum and dad making you who you are. Anim: show the gene transfer to the child as an animation.





VO: Autosomal Recessive or ARPKD


Anim: Parent's genes move to each children. When the purple child apppears, the other children blurs out




VO: and Autosomal Dominant or ADPKD




VO: This video is about ARPKD






VO: ARPKD happens when you have mistakes in a gene you get from both mum and dad Anim: showing the genes from mum and dad going to the PKD child



VO: and often starts very early on, sometimes even before being born! Anim: baby growing inside the womb




VO: the kidney cysts may be seen on scans done to check on a baby before it's born


VO: Problems could be: High blood pressure Back or side pain Blood in your urine




VO: A feeling of being full in your tummy even if you haven't eaten anything A bigger tummy




VO: Headaches Kidney stones Urine infections




VO: Your kidneys can't concentrate your urine so you may often feel thirsty, wee lots and bed wetting is common!

VO: but others may have lots.










VO: sometimes the working parts of the kidney are taken over by the cysts




VO: and may even talk about treatments like dialysis or a kidney transplant.






VO: Keeping your kidneys as healthy as possible is always a good idea!. Some ways of doing this are..







VO: Eat a healthy low-salt diet and keep to a healthy weight.




VO: drink plenty of water
